AMENDMENT NO. - III

Subject: Tender for “Procurement and supply of Advance Life Support Ambulance (ALS) and Basic Life Support Ambulance (BLS)”.

Tender No. HSCC/PUR/AMBULANCE/2026/131 Dated 16.01.2026

This has reference to the above tender, the following Amendment may be noted which shall be treated as part of the contract to be uploaded & submitted along with their tender/ bid:

The following clauses are hereby added and shall supersede all corresponding and/or conflicting clauses mentioned in the tender document:

1. Transportation of fully integrated, equipped and operational ambulances upto Victoria-Mahe, Seychelles by sea;
2. On-site Trial, On-site Commissioning and On-site Training of Local Personnel.
3. The export of goods or services is considered as a zero-rated supply, hence, GST is not levied on export of any kind of goods or services. Bidder is advised that during supply of equipment, it should clearly indicate the name and address of High Commission of India, Victoria-Mahe, Seychelles as the consignee.
4. The manufacturer of Ambulances should have valid licenses and certifications, primarily National Ambulance Code (AIS-125) under the Ministry of Road Transport & Highways (MoRTH) for vehicle standards, safety and design and should have valid manufacturing license/registration certificate and other statutory certification by the Central Drugs Standard Control Organization (CDSCO) under the MDR 2017 for medical equipment's. The HSCC/ Ministry/consignee reserves the right for audit/inspection at any point of time. The ambulances and medical devices installed therein should confirm to the standards of product specifications as indicated in the Technical specifications enclosed. The FAT report/ PASS Test Report of supplied ambulances/equipment's should be submitted. **The ambulances should include an adequate initial stock of necessary medical and operational supplies as the "start-up kits" to ensure immediate operational readiness, with minimum self life of 12 months.**
5. **Packaging:** The Primary and Secondary packaging should confirm the market standards enough to withstand transportation stress to ambulances/medical devices/equipment's and to protect from rough handling, sea weather, and road transportation to reach the destination in an undamaged condition. The Packaging should have **“Gift from the people and the Republic of Government of India”** printed on the Ambulances and tertiary packing boxes in addition to relevant details (make, model, specifications, medical equipment included). **A sticker of the National Flag of India of the appropriate size should also be embossed on the Ambulances.**

6. Payment to the contractor for the procurement of BLS and ALS Ambulances is exempted from GST. GST is applicable on transportation, and subjected to TDS as per rules.
7. Where more than one freight forwarder is available, bidder shall exercise due economy in the selection of the freight forwarder. If this is not so, bidder shall record the reasons and adequate justifications for choosing a particular vendor.
8. Bidder shall ensure completion of all requisite formalities viz. pre dispatch inspection, documentation, insurance, etc. keeping in view specific requirements as may be applicable to Government of Seychelles. Bidder shall also ensure that requisite clearances, NOC from concerned Indian authorities are processed well in time.
9. **Terms of payment:** Bidder shall be eligible for 30% advance payment towards the cost of supplied items on submission of Bank Guarantee of equivalent amount .The remaining payment of 65% of actual cost after adjusting the released advance including GST thereon, packaging, transportation etc. would be released and upon successful completion of delivery and submission of bills, vouchers FAT/ passed test reports of all items along with photos of primary/secondary packaging (wherever required in case of ambulances) clearly depicting the Batch/Lot No. & Mfg. details, valid license/Registration certificate of the manufacturer, all quality test certificates and proofs of successful training & commissioning in good condition at the designated consignee site. The remaining payment of 05% of actual cost shall the released after completion of the warranty period. Other terms shall remain same of SCC clause no. 12.
10. Ambulances supplied to the Seychelles should have warranty of minimum 01 (One) year including the required consumables for the smooth operation of the Basic Life Support (BLS) and Advanced Life Support (ALS) Ambulances.
11. **Performance Bank Guarantee (PBG):** PBG should be submitted **within ten days**. Other terms/ clause no. 6 under SCC shall remain same.
12. Irrespective of the specifications mentioned in **Annexure-I**, it shall be deemed that the Supplier is fully aware that the ambulances are intended to operate in extremely steep hilly terrain in the Republic of Seychelles. Accordingly, it shall be the sole responsibility of the Supplier to ensure that the vehicles supplied are fully compatible with the intended operating conditions.
 - 12.1 For this purpose, the Supplier shall provide one (1) vehicle for trial in the Seychelles within forty five (45) days if delivered by sea, or within two (2) weeks if delivered by air cargo, as applicable, from the date of issuance of this Purchase Order. Delivery of the remaining vehicles shall be permitted only upon satisfactory testing and approval of the trial vehicle by the Host Country.
 - 12.2 All expenses related to the delivery of the trial vehicle to the Seychelles shall be borne by the Supplier. In the event that the trial vehicle is found suitable and approved by the Host Country, such expenses shall be adjusted against the payment due to the Supplier. However, if the trial vehicle fails to meet the requirements or does not receive approval from the Host Country, the entire cost of transportation (to and from) shall be borne solely by the Supplier. In such case, the Supplier shall remain obligated to supply ten (10) compatible ambulances to the Seychelles, either through the same or an alternative vendor, at no additional cost to this HSCC.

13. The remaining or complete ten (10) ambulances, as applicable, shall be delivered to the Consignee at the designated address in Victoria-Mahe, Seychelles within the following timelines:
 - 13.1 Within forty five (45) days of the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA)/HSCC will convey to supplier that the trial vehicle has been found suitable by the Host Country; or
 - 13.2 Within seventy-five (75) days of the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA)/HSCC will convey to Supplier that the trial vehicle has been found **NOT** suitable by the Host Country, as the case may be.
14. The onsite trail, commissioning and training should be completed within next 15 days, in each case. In case of anticipated delay due to unavoidable circumstances, HSCC/ MEA may be informed in time to revise the date of delivery. However, MEA/HSCC remains the final authority to revise the date of delivery, on case to case basis.
15. **Liquidated Damages:** (SSC Clause no. 16) Subject to force majeure, if the Supplier fails to deliver, any or all of the Goods or perform the Services within the time period(s) specified in the Contract and during the warranty period the Purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the Contract or, deduct from the Contract price, as Liquidated Damages, a sum equivalent to **01%** of the price of the delayed Goods or unperformed Services for each week of delay until actual delivery or performance, up to a maximum deduction of 10% of the value of the delayed portion of work. Once the maximum is reached, the Purchaser may consider termination of contract.
